ETIQUETTE OF BOWLS:

The Etiquette of Bowls is a combination of good manners, sportsmanship and social ability and is designed to promote the friendliness and sportsmanship for which the sport has rightly been known. Some points to be remembered:-

- 1.Don't drop bowls from the bank to the green, respect the surface of the green.
- 2. Keep quiet and still while players are on the mat.
- 3. Stand at least one metre behind the bowler on the mat.
- 4. Don't query the skips instructions.
- 5. Acknowledge good shots from your opponents and thank them if they do the same to you.
- 6. Learn to be a good marker. Stand behind the head and to one side.
- 7. Learn the correct way to score the card.
